## **St. John's Cemetery Association Annual Meeting Minutes- January 28, 2024**

The annual meeting of St. John's Cemetery Association was called to order by David Huebert following the church's annual meeting.

Minutes from the 2024 annual meeting were read by Celine Swift, hearing no additions or corrections, minutes were approved as read.

Financial report was read by Celine Swift, hearing no additions or corrections, minutes were approved as read.

**Old Business:**

- Mark Wigern continues to mow our lawn and is doing a great job. Thanks Mark!
- Spraying for 2024 was again done by Allen Raduenz of Top Notch Turf.



## New Business:

- Three burials took place in 2024: Margie Block, Richard Swift, and Maynard Rannow.
- We plan to continue with Mark Wigern for mowing in 2025. Mark's rate for mowing is \$260.
- We expect to use Allen Raduenz for spraying again. We will plan to go ahead unless the quote seems unreasonable (\$1210 for 2023 and 2024). This year we plan to have him apply two spray treatments to try to get ahead of the creeping Charlie.
- The Cemetery Committee has been meeting frequently to work on updating the bylaws. The need to update the bylaws was instigated largely because of cremations and all the complications they bring. The new documents should also help with continuity when new members join the Cemetery Committee:
  - We learned from our lawyer that the cemetery should not act as a separate entity from the church, but rather operate under the umbrella of St. John's, like any other organization in the church. (e.g. - Cemetery Committee, instead of Association or Board)
  - We are working to write a policy (or set of policies) to replace the bylaws. Once we have a complete working draft, we will call in a team of experts (previous Cemetery Board members) to review and provide input.
  - Our goal is to have a congregational meeting later this year to adopt the policy/policies.
  - Accordingly, we expect this will be the last year that the Cemetery has its own annual meeting. Going forward the cemetery committee will report during the annual meeting like any other committee.
- The Cemetery Committee is also working to update the Cemetery Map and the Cemetery Book, which should also be in place later this year.
- David Huebert's first term is complete, but he is eligible for reelection. David Swift made the motion to nominate David Huebert, and moved that nominations cease to cast a unanimous ballot for the nominee. Motion carried.

## Other Business:
