From Pastor Bob

A friend sent this story to me and thought it was worth sharing with you.

Two men, both seriously ill, occupied the same hospital room. One man was allowed to sit up in his bed for an hour each afternoon to help drain the fluid from his lungs. His bed was next to the room's only window. The other man had to spend all his time flat on his back.

The men talked for hours on end. They spoke of their wives and families, their homes, their jobs, their involvement in the military service, where they had been on vacation. Every afternoon, when the man in the bed by the window could sit up, he would pass the time by describing to his roommate all the things he could see outside the window.

The man in the other bed began to live for those one hour periods where his world would be broadened and enlivened by all the activity and color of the world outside. The window overlooked a park with a lovely lake. Ducks and swans played on the water while children sailed their model boats. Young lovers walked arm in arm amidst flowers of every color and a fine view of the city skyline could be seen in the distance. As the man by the window described all this in exquisite details, the man on the other side of the room would close his eyes and imagine this picturesque scene.

One warm afternoon, the man by the window described a parade passing by. Although the other man could not hear the band he could see it in his mind's eye as the gentleman by the window portrayed it with descriptive words.

Days, weeks and months passed. One morning, the day nurse arrived to bring water for their baths only to find the lifeless body of the man by the window, who had died peacefully in his sleep. She was saddened and called the hospital attendants to take the body away.

Annual Meeting Minutes 1/20/2013

The meeting was called to order by President Brian Vacek. Pastor Bob opened with a prayer. Members of the council present; Brian Alsleben, Doug Block, Cory Garoutte and Brian Vacek, members not present; Mandy Grack and Randy Rose.

President Brian Vacek read the minutes of the annual meeting from January 15, 2012.

The minutes were approved as read. Brian Alsleben gave the reports of the General Fund, Memorial Fund, Congregational Direct Giving, and the Youth Group. Doug Block gave the report on Building Fund. Julie Karl gave the report of the Benevolence Giving.

Mavis Mielke gave the report on the Women's Guild. Brenda Garoutte gave the report on the Sunday School. All reports were approved as read.

St. John's Church Membership and Attendance and Changes was read by Dave Swift for Celine. Report of the Financial Review Committee was given by Dave Swift, they found all work in good order.

Service Times: Winter Hours will be Sunday School 9:15, Worship 10:30.

Summer Hours will be at 9:30(from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day weekend), with the 2nd Sunday each month being an outdoor service. The 2nd Sunday in August Worship Service will be held at Heatwole..

Lenten Service Time will be 7 p.m. with lunch following.

Holiday Services ; Good Friday 7:00 p.m., Easter 9:30 a.m., Thanksgiving 9:30 a.m. Christmas Eve 5:00 p.m. Sunday School Christmas Program was changed to the 3rd Sunday in December being held

during the morning worship time. This was voted on with Mary Huebert making a motion to change it with Gene Konerza 2nd the motion. It was voted on and approved. Confirmation will be held on May 5th.

Old Business:

Furnaces are in and working very well.

Funeral Services have gone well, with 2 council member present or filling the spots by members of the church for the service. This will remain in 2013.

Photo Directories have been completed and went well. A Thank you to Andrea Wigern and Julie Karl for the work they did with this.

New Business:

Budget for 2013 was gone over and approved .

Wages: Secretary and Organist to remain the same.

Pastor Salary; Pastor requested no increase in his wages, but the congregation felt he deserves an increase, it was voted on and accepted. He will get a 3% increase.

Council to check on changing Vanguard account, if there is some other way to earn better interest on it. (Jerry Block questioned it and it was voted to have the council check on it).

By the request of Dave Sanken, (who rents the church land) rent will go up from \$200.00 to \$300.00

Volunteers/Staff and Elections:

Need three members for the Council; Dave Huebert nominated David Swift, Mary Garoutte nominated Joe Blackbird, and Jerome Karl nominated Cory Garoutte to serve a second term; Cory said he'd serve a second term. All were voted on and approved. Brian Vacek had served his two terms, and Mandy Grack did not wish to fill another term.

Financial Review Committee will be Jerry Block, Roger Trimbo, Celine Swift.

Benevolence Committee will be; Elaine Carrigan, Julie Karl, and Dave Sanken, Record Keeper will be Celine Swift.

Nursery Committee will be Michelle Alsleben, Mary Taylor and Kathy Trimbo.

Ice Cream Social Committee for 2013 will be; Warren & Bonnie Kaufmann, Jerry and Charlie Block, and Julie Karl. Ice Cream Social will be on Thursday, June 13th.

Roof Project; Contractor will be Tim Hahn, we will be putting 25 years asphalt shingles on the church. They will be shadow shingles the color will be determined by the congregation when we get the samples from Tim. The complete job will be \$18,500.00, with some extra for taking the chimney down to the roof line. He had overlooked it at the time of the bid, but it was felt it would not cost that much more that the council would not go over the \$20,000 limit that set for this project. It will be completed in May if the weather is good and no unforeseen things happen.

Replacing the old chairs from the shed was discussed, the chairs are in very poor condition and should not be used any longer. The council will check on memorial money and decide how many will be purchased at a time or if all will be replaced. They will put the new ones downstairs and take the best ones from the downstairs chairs now for using outdoors.

Miscellaneous items;

Brian Vacek apologized for not getting the furnace turned up for the Christmas Eve service, because he lost his key and couldn't get in the church.

Jerry Block questioned if we should clean the shed out or do some project to get more room.

Being no other business, Jerry Block made a motion to adjourn, motion was 2nd.

Meeting adjourned.

Cemetery Association Meeting was called to order by Jon Block, President.

Minutes were read and approved. The Cemetery Funds reports were read; there was a question about the \$2,600.00 that went in the savings account from offering envelopes, Dave Sanken was not present so they are going to check with him and if anyone needs an answer they can call Jon Block.

The lawn mowing will be given to Mike Schmalz , he is known by the board members and will do a good job. Green Earth Lawn Care raised their prices.

Curt Paulsen term was up, but is willing to serve again. Motion was made by Jon and seconded by Jerry to reelect Curt Paulsen for another term. Motion carried.

If ever you have a question about the cemetery you are asked to call one of the board members. Their names and phone numbers will be listed on the back of the weekly bulletins.

Motion was made and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried.

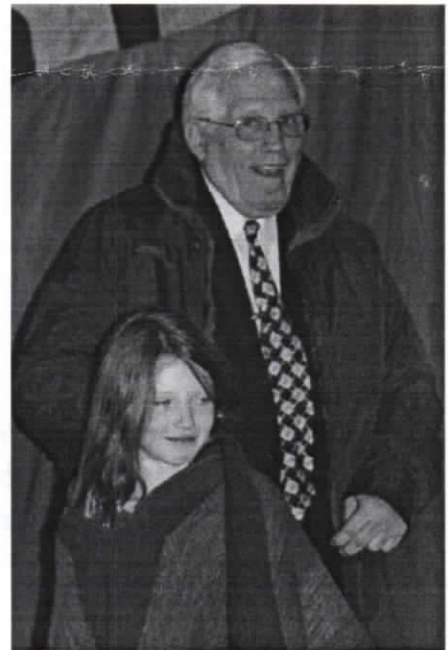

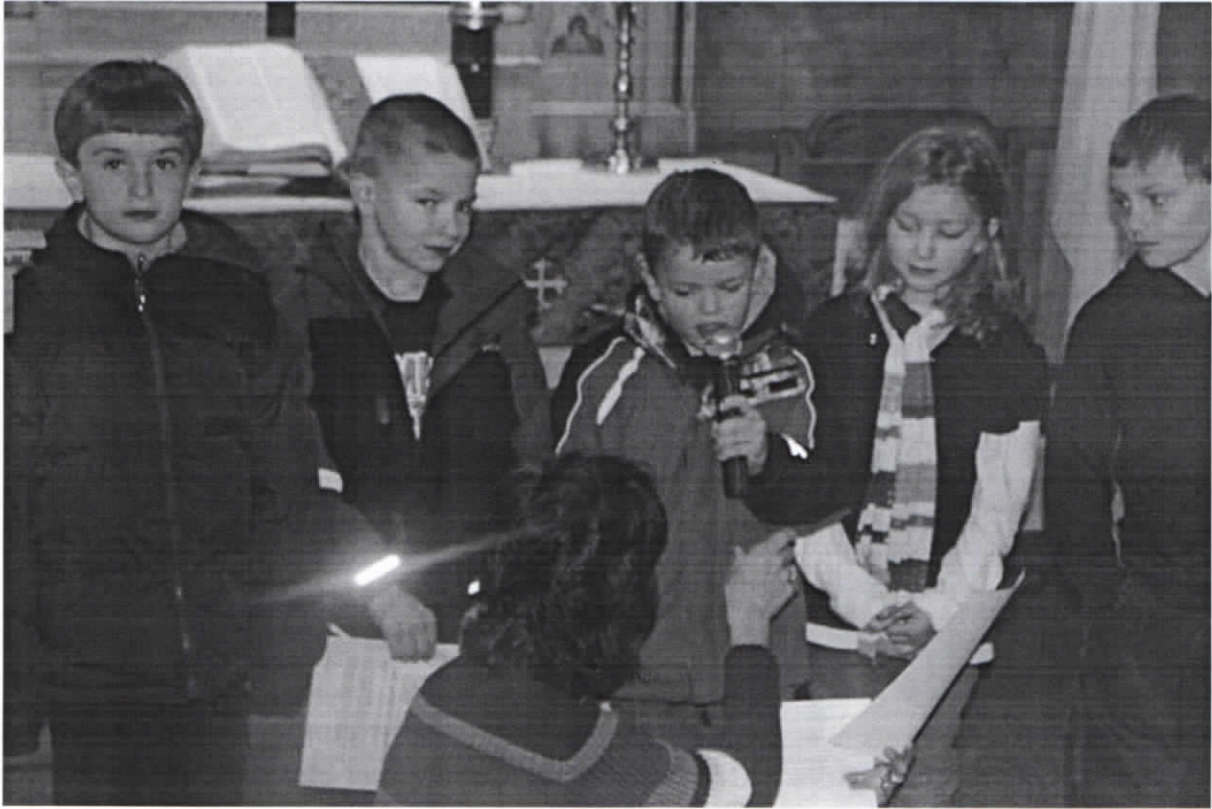
