## **Pastor's Notes**



## The mind of man plans his way, But the LORD directs his steps. Proverbs 16:9 NASB

As many of you know, recently Mary and I took a few days to travel to Myrtle Beach, SC to meet our little great granddaughter, Embri. There were many things we took from our trip but one of the most humbling was seeing clearly God's sovereign hand guiding and leading us.

The trip was approximately 1500 miles each way. We allowed three days of travel coming and going which meant that we drove about 10 hours plus each day while traveling.

We made the same trip last October to be present for our granddaughter Jordan's wedding with the addition of stopping to see Mary's Thai sister and her husband in Roanoke, Virginia. Again, the Lord's leading was evident. Just a few days before we were to leave, our son Nick had emergency surgery to have his appendix removed. Infection delayed his release from the hospital putting our trip in jeopardy. Nick seemed to be getting better but the surgeon gave no indication of when he might be released. I prayed for wisdom about the trip and had great peace about leaving the next day not knowing when Nick would be released from the hospital. We headed off to Roanoke and shortly after got word Nick was released from the hospital. Keith picked him up at the hospital and Nick was able to catch his flight to Myrtle Beach for the wedding as well. Praise God for putting all the pieces together in such a way that we could not avoid seeing His hand at work in it all.

Now, for our trip home from South Carolina this year. We left Myrtle Beach on Wednesday, October 17<sup>th</sup>. The last night before getting home we decided to stop for the night in Rochelle, IL. We had stopped there on our last trip and enjoyed the hotel and a nearby restaurant. As we drove into Rochelle, I was amazed at how we arrived at the hotel we did last year because it was in the middle of town, not out by the interstate. We

settled in and I went to run a few errands including getting my car washed, which came as no surprise to Mary. But while running the errands I began to shake uncontrollably. I thought I was just cold but it was more than that. As soon as I got back to the room, I crawled in bed and told Mary that I didn't feel like going out to that little restaurant we were looking forward to eating at again. Even with extra blankets, I couldn't stop shaking. Mary decided we need to go the hospital, which was just a couple of blocks from the hotel. No coincidence. The staff there was exceedingly kind and efficient. After a number of tests, it was determined that I had a urinary track infection. I was given an iv bag of antibiotics before leaving the hospital and a prescription which we filled at the local Wal-Mart before we left town the next morning. Again, I saw clearly God's sovereign hand leading and directing us to be just where we needed be when I needed treatment.

We got home late afternoon on Friday, October 19<sup>th</sup>. Later that night I got a call from Celine Swift. Celine was calling on behalf of the Council. The Council wanted me to take another Sunday off to heal but I assured Celine that I was feeling great ready to go for Sunday. Celine asked to talk to Mary to make sure that I was telling the truth about feeling okay. Again, I was reminded of the kindness and thoughtfulness of our church family at St. John's. Mary had alerted the prayer chain about my illness and received many inquiries about my health. How blessed I am to be the pastor of such a loving, caring church family. Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

On Monday, Mary received a call from the hospital in Rochelle, IL. The results of the testing had come back from my visit the previous Thursday night and it was determined that I needed a different and more powerful antibiotic to deal with the infection. Mary and I were again amazed at the thoroughness of the hospital staff in Rochelle. We were so impressed that Mary wrote a letter to the administrator. It was no accident that we happened to stay again at the Comfort Inn and Suites in Rochelle, IL. It was the place the Lord wanted us to be. It's a wonderful thing to be able to see God's sovereign hand leading and directing our lives as we did on our trips to South Carolina these past two Octobers. May He give you the eyes as well to see His kind and gracious hand guiding and directing every detail of your lives as well.

## August 2, 2018

Dave Huebert called the meeting to order. Pastor Bob opened the meeting with prayer and a devotional.

### Pastor's Report:

- Visitation: Maynard Rannow, Kari Eischens, Joyce Karl, Nadine Forbes, Lillian Nemitz, Duane & Gloria Wigern, Dick Swift, Annie Barth
- I ordered new confirmation material. It is from the same company as before and is part of their *Life in Christ* series. The theme of the last material I used was *Not My Own*. The new material is focused on tracing the promise of Christ from the beginning of the Bible through Revelation and is called *God's Unfolding Promise*. There will be 7 confirmation students this year.
- I purchased toner cartridge for the church's printer
- On Thursday, August 2, 2018 Maggie May Barth was born in Hutchinson, MN to Annie and Tony Barth
- We had another great VBS with 30 students, 15 young adult helpers, and 17 adults.

Robyn Field reported the balance at Vanguard: \$6297.29, and Citizen's bank \$25,082.46. It was too early in the month to receive Building Fund and Hutch Coop statements.

Financial reports were approved as given.

#### **Old Business:**

• Michelle Alsleben came to the council meeting to discuss a proposal for an outreach program featuring the Gould Brothers. They are Christians who incorporate a good salvation message with an entertaining trick shooting show. They charge \$5000 for both brothers to perform, or \$3500 for one. The Youth Group and Women's Guild have each offered to give \$1000 towards the program. The thought is to do this next summer so as not to conflict with the building project this fall. They are considering coordinating this event with a couple other churches, such as Cross Point Church in Hutchinson or Grace Bible Church in

Silver Lake, but would strive to have the event happen at St. John's. They would work to avoid Game Fair weekend, which is usually early August. To see a preview of what the Gould Brothers do, go to GouldBrothers.com. The council encouraged Michelle to continue looking into this idea.

- Celine Swift sent a copy of the constitution to each of the council members to review. Celine will also send an outline of the policies to the council.
- The council discussed the potential new lighted memorial sign. Pastor Bob will talk to Gene Konerza about the status and if any ground work should be done in conjunction with the building project to prepare for electricity. (Pastor Bob spoke to Gene and they do not believe anything needs to be done at this time.)
- The malfunctioning elevator phone has been repaired with the help of Dave Swift. The phone's manufacturer, Viking Electronics, replaced the circuit board.
- Thanks to Dave Sanken for repairing a washout hole in the new grass parking lot.

### New Business:

- Warren Kauffman requested the use of table and chairs for this weekend. Approved
- Update on new addition: the factory build will begin when all components are in. The current hold-up is the fire doors required by the state. As soon as they arrive, the factory build will begin in conjunction with foundation work at St. John's.
- The council discussed the annual church cleaning. It will be scheduled after the new addition is complete. Pastor Bob will talk to the Women's Guild about waiting until next year to wax the basement floors so as not to conflict with Sunday School.
- Celine will bring a note and map to Heatwole for Dave Huebert to post on the church door on Sunday.
- VBS leaders have requested storage for the VBS decoration materials. The Swifts are planning to tear down their shed so they have asked for them to be stored somewhere else. Pastor Bob will make an announcement to see if anyone else can store them.
- Dave Sanken suggested that Pastor Bob might want to submit articles for the Pastor's Corner is in the Hutchinson and Glencoe newspapers. Dave Sanken will contact the Hutchinson Paper.

Robyn Field reported the Building Fund has a balance of \$134,445.31. Citizen's Bank: \$25,086.72, Hutchinson Coop \$103,027.28, Vanguard: \$6,331.31

#### **Old Business:**

- Updates about our fall worship hours to newspaper, church sign, and website are complete.
- Mavis Mielke treated the large stain in the church entryway. Thanks Mavis, it looks great!

#### New Business:

- Roxanne Sladek proposed a having a Youth Revival conference here at the church sometime in January. The council liked the idea.
- Dave Huebert spoke to our insurance agent, Chris Hunter. The church property is valued at \$954,000, and contents are valued at \$244,100. Our coverage includes replacement value, lawsuits and liability protection.
- Sunday School Addition Update:
  - Dave Huebert and Dave Swift reviewed the final plans with Mike at Lifestyle Homes. The changes they requested on the internal layout on final prints has been implemented. Dave Huebert also informed the council that one of the requirements for State approval was that the 10 feet

between buildings is not wall to wall, but dripline to dripline. Because of that, the building will need to be further north than originally planned. This puts the foundation too close to the ash trees. MSA to remove those trees before the project begins. (Update: trees were removed by Glen Sladek. Thanks Glen!)

- The addition foundation will also be closer to the septic tanks, but no action is required.
- Flooring and paint choices were reviewed. The walls will be the same color that we have in the church entry (Benjamin Moore HC28, Shelburn Buff).
- When reorganizing the softener room, the plan is to get rid of that toilet and sink, since we will have an additional bathroom upstairs. Dave Swift will take care of cleaning up the plumbing in that room. Discussed adding a mop sink, but decided no since it would require cutting into the floor for a drain trap.
- Our lawn care service provider suggests trimming trees and spraying weeds. Council plans to bring this up for discussion at the annual meeting, along with how to manage the north row of evergreens.
- MSA to renew \$500 scholarship to Casey paid through the Benevolence Committee.
- Council reviewed the church Policies.
  - Bring up at annual meeting to increase fees for church use by non-members
  - Review new members and new adults to see if they need background checks.
  - Celine Swift will add to the council annual check list for March to get new background checks for all who need it.
- Grace is playing for Mary on Sunday 9/23/18
- Randy Knick proposed that we ask the congregation to submit ideas for a name for the new Sunday School addition. Pastor Bob will put in the bulletin that people can put their ideas in the suggestion box. Some ideas Randy had are:

#### **Old Business:**

- Jerome Karl has volunteered to take care of weed spraying.
- Robyn Field arranged with the Benevolence Committee to pay the \$500 scholarship to Casey Blackbird on behalf of St. John's Church. Mandy Mielke will write and deliver the checks to him for both the scholarship and preaching Sunday.
- Grace Garoutte played for the service on September 23. Thanks, Grace!
- The water hose has been put away

#### New Business:

- Curt Bussler will do snow removal for us again this year for the same price as last year. After the ramp to the new addition is complete, he will quote how much extra will be needed to clear the ramp for us.
- The church will need additional insurance for the addition once the building arrives. Dave Huebert will take care of this.
- Sunday School Addition Update:

- The reason only a few layers of block has been placed for the foundation is because they are waiting for the cement to cure.
- The cost of installing a submersible pump and the associated plumbing was \$3241.92, which was significantly higher than the original \$2000 estimate. This was largely due to the fact that we had to change to a 3" pump when the 4" pump would only go down 20 feet. The new pressure tank is installed. MSA to accept the quote for payment.
- Dave Huebert & Dave Swift will work with Lifestyle Homes to decide how much money of the final payment to hold back on the building project until the final landscape work (levelling, seeding, etc.) is complete in the spring.
- The CCCC's has sent out their annual survey. Celine Swift will fill it out and submit it.
- An audit needs to be completed for worker's compensation. Mandy Grack will take care of it.
- Mandy Grack is still chasing down some information to complete the memorial plaque update.
- Pastor Bob was approached about how it can be hard to hear him when he tips his head down. Pastor Bob proposed he would purchase a headset microphone to see if that would address the problem. The council discussed that if a headset was the right solution, then the church should pay for it, and to make sure it ties in well with our current sound system. Celine will ask Dave Swift to research our best option(s).

- It is time to turn off the AC and set the heat, change furnace filters and check the furnace. Dave Sanken will work with Michael Sanken to get it done.
- Test elevator phone done.
