- General Fund - \$ 28,933.32

Brian Alsleben gave the Building Fund report: The Citizen's Bank balance is: \$482.76, which is low until we receive the ~\$8500 refund from canceling Guide One insurance. Vanguard balance is \$ 51,748.10.

The secretary's minutes and financial reports were approved as given.

Old Business:

- Property and worker's Comp were switched over to NorthStar and SFM respectively on Dec 1.
- Celine Swift looked into getting Amazon Smile kickbacks for our church, but our church is not eligible for that program. If people who shop at Amazon wish to apply the kickbacks to Common Cup Ministry instead, you can do so by shopping at smile.amazon.com and search for Common Cup Ministry under the "Supporting" tab.
- The light in the elevator has been repaired. Thank you David Swift!
- Pam Martin received back several performance review forms from various church members, all with very good remarks for Pastor Bob. The results were reviewed with Pastor Bob.
- Membership list – letters were sent to two inactive members.
- Discussed options for persons to invite to fill the council vacancy.

New Business:

- Tree trimming was authorized by council via electronic communication. Dave Huebert plans to clean up the lower branches on the trees south of the parking long. Thanks Dave!
- Motion/Second/Carried to propose at congregational meeting that Easter service be at 10:30am going forward to minimize confusion for guests and new members. This also would apply to all Sunday holidays, including Christmas day when it falls on a Sunday.
- The council considered adding to the annual meeting agenda to discuss removing the north row of pine trees. This was tabled until the council can get a cost estimate for the project.
- M/S/C to receive Myra Martin as new member.
- M/S/C to update Personnel Policy to include a plan for if a misconduct claim arises, per North Star insurance company's requirement. One line was inserted at the end of Section A of the Personnel Policy that says, "Sexual Misconduct claim: Should a claim of sexual misconduct arise, it should immediately be brought to the attention of a council member."
- Joe Blackbird purchased a replacement cordless hand-vac and will get it installed.

Brian Alsleben gave the Building Fund report: The Citizen's Bank balance is: \$1322.16. Vanguard balance is \$ 51,850.15. The refund from Guide One insurance of \$7280.17 was just received and will be deposited.

The secretary's minutes and financial reports were approved as given.

Old Business:

- Membership list – letters were sent to two inactive members. There has been no response, so their names will be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting to vote on releasing them from membership.
- Discussed options for persons to fill the council vacancy. Pastor Bob talked with a few members, but they declined to serve at this time.
- Contact staff on their pay- Mary Huebert believes that \$50 for fill in organist pay is still OK for the area, though funeral homes charge \$75 or more. The secretary's pay will also stay the same.
- Photosensor light by front door. Joe Blackbird is working with an electrician to establish the viability of the project. They will also troubleshoot the steeple light when he comes.

New Business:

- FYI from Jodi Sanken – she has worked out a deal with Mary Huebert giving Sunday School use of Mary’s laptop for Sunday School projects.
- Motion/Second/Carried to increase pay for supply pastors to \$300 per service, plus mileage, unless survey of area churches suggests this is out of line for the area. Celine Swift will contact area churches. Casey Blackbird estimates 10-20 hours of preparation for leading a worship service.
- M/S/C to propose a 5% increase in pay for Pastor Bob to be approved at the Congregational meeting.
- Elmer Baysinger has volunteered to be considered for the council.
- Shingles on West side of Faith center have blown off. Joe Blackbird will get more shingles and ask Travis Brecht if he is willing to do the repair.
- Lillian Nemitz gifted a large donation to the church in her will. M/S/C to set aside the money in a separate fund while looking into setting up an Endowment. M/S/C to form a committee including Brian Alsleben, David Swift, Pastor Bob, and invite Lea Ette Peters to work with the committee. Also invite James Peters, who is a financial advisor, to present information to the committee and/or the council on how to set up an endowment for this money and potential future gifts from others.
- The elevator permit is up to date. Thanks to Dave Swift for repairing the elevator light.
- There have been two times recently when the elevator failed and needed to be reset. Celine Swift will ask Dave Swift to troubleshoot.

Annual Meeting Minutes January 23, 2022

President Joe Blackbird called the meeting to order. 31 members were in attendance. Pastor Bob Taylor opened the meeting with prayer.

Clipboards were passed around for those in attendance to sign-up for ushering / custodial / communion duties.

- Celine Swift read the minutes from the 2021 Annual Meeting. The minutes were approved as presented.
- Review of the Annual Reports were given as follows:
 - **General Fund, Memorial Fund, Choir Fund, and Congregational Direct Giving were given** by Karen Konerza
 - **Membership & Attendance Record** by Karen Konerza
 - **Benevolence** by Karen Konerza
 - **Building Fund** by Joe Blackbird
 - **Women's Guild** by Brenda Schaefer
 - **Youth Group** by Andrea Wigern
 - **Sunday School** by Brenda Garoutte
 - **Financial Review** report was given by Brenda Garoutte. She stated that the review committee found the financial records for 2021 were accurate and in good order.

Motion/Second/Carried to approve all reports as presented.

New Business:

- Membership – M/S/C to release Cole Cameron and Eric Rose from membership, consistent with the Membership Policy.
- Online giving – Joe Blackbird reminded the congregation that online giving is available. In 2021 four families chose to give their regular offerings by automatic payments, and the process is going well. Members may talk to Celine Swift or Karen Konerza with questions, or to get a form to sign up for this option.
- Joe Blackbird presented the **Operating Budget** report. Last year there was an extra line item for Mike Norbomm's audio-visual technical support for online services. (Thanks Mike!) And the only organist expenses were for fill-in organists, because Mary Huebert donated her organist services again this year. (Thanks Mary!). The Secretary's salary and Organist's salary would stay the same. The budget included a 5% increase in salary for Pastor Bob as suggested by the council. Dave Swift noticed a math error in the proposed pastor compensation. The corrected proposed salary is \$51,327, and the corrected total budget is \$78,997. In order to meet the budget, on average, each family unit will need to contribute about \$2422 total for the year. This equates to about \$46 for 52 weeks. M/S/C to accept the corrected budget.
- Joe Blackbird reviewed the proposed 2022 Service times and dates. Dates and times are all equivalent to last year, except Easter Service will be at 10:30am. This was proposed to help alleviate confusion. There will be a Christmas day service (also at 10:30am) in addition to Christmas Eve, since Christmas falls on a Sunday this year. Congregation approved.
- Joe Blackbird informed the congregation of the generous gift from the estate of Lillian Nemitz of \$440,508.30 to the church. A similar gift was given to the Women's Guild. The council decided at the January meeting to set aside the money in a separate fund while looking into setting up an Endowment. A committee was formed including Brian Alsleben, David Swift, Pastor Bob, Joe Blackbird with an invitation to Lea Ette Peters to be involved. The committee will work with James Peters, who is a financial advisor, to research how to set up the endowment for this money, as well as potential future gifts from others. This would protect the principal and provide interest income. Jerome Karl asked what would happen to these funds if the church were to close. The Bylaws state that all assets of the church would go to the cemetery board for perpetual care of the cemetery. Pastor Bob gave a heartfelt reminder to the congregation of the many blessings Lillian and Irene gave to the church over the years with their humble service.
- Volunteers/Staff Elections

- **Council:** Celine Swift has completed her second term on the council; Elmer Baysinger volunteered to serve on the council in her place. Joe Blackbird has completed his 1st term, and has volunteered for a second term. Brian Alsleben, who was covering the vacant council position, has volunteered to serve again on the council. M/S/C to elect Elmer and Brian to be elected for their first terms, and for Joe to be reelected for a second term. Motion carried.
- **Ice Cream Social Committee** – June 9th, 2022. Joe Blackbird asked for volunteers for the committee. There was discussion that we should set up a committee to move forward with planning, and the committee can decide if the social needs to be canceled. Pastor Bob, Marcie Baysinger, and Roxanne Sladek volunteered. A note will be put in the bulletin and newsletter asking for more volunteers to be on the committee. Jerry Block informed the congregation that he has sold his tent business, so the committee will have to look elsewhere if they want tents. Some places in Waconia charge as much as \$500 to rent a tent. Julie Karl noted that the flower sales money will remain with the Youth Group whether or not the Ice Cream Social happens this year. Celine Swift informed the congregation that the flower sales will look different this year, as Gertens is allowing only online sales.
- **Financial Review Committee** – Pam Martin and Brenda Garoutte will be on the committee. Joe Blackbird will check with Brian Alsleben to see if he wants to serve on the committee again.
- **Benevolence Committee** – Elaine Carrigan and Mavis Mielke
- **Nursery Committee** – Mary Taylor will be on the committee again, and will check with June Knick, Michelle Alsleben, Ashley Alsleben, and Jessica Alsleben to see if they want to continue to serve on the committee.
- **Records Keeper** – Karen Konerza
- M/S/C to accept the above committee volunteers. Motion carried.
- Marcie Baysinger asked the congregation if we want her to continue making homemade bread for Communion. The congregation appreciates the homemade bread, and would like to continue with the option of ½ homemade bread and ½ wafers to be offered for Communion.

A motion was duly made and seconded to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.
