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
## **Reflections**

### **Council Reports**

### July 19th, 2023

**Council Members Present:** All council members were present except for Pam. Pastor Barry was also in attendance.

Joe called the meeting to order. Pastor Barry opened the meeting with prayer which included those who are ill and those in recovery. He shared a devotional on how the Church should be outward looking and not necessarily doing the same thing all the time. He also talked about having a community hymn sing – possibly September 17<sup>th</sup>.

The secretary's minutes were approved from the June 19<sup>th</sup> meeting. Dawn gave the treasurer's report. The beginning balance was \$50,461.01 with an ending balance of \$54,231.92.

Brian gave the building fund report. The balance in the checking account is \$9,359.30. This balance reflects the payment for the seal coating of the parking lot, electrical work for handicap door, and the cleaning of the carpet.

The Vanguard balance is \$95,257.61. He also mentioned we will be getting an invoice from Access Lift for around \$1,318.00 for repairs done to the elevator.

All financial reports were approved as given.

### **Old Business:**

- -- Dawn reported that the memorial book and plaque are up to date.
- -- The AED is still in discussion.
- -- LEO Ministries met at the Church on July 17th. They will continue to meet by-monthly.

### New Business:

- Elevator problems have been addressed. The elevator does get inspected once a year. Batteries needed to get replaced. After several adjustments it seems to be working fine right now.
- Joe suggested that we go back to greeting each other in Church and back to doing the hymn sing when there is no choir or Sunday School kids singing during the summer. The council and Pastor Barry agreed.
- It was brought up that during the summer months the A/C may need to be adjusted to cool sooner. Joe will set the thermostat to start sooner.
- > Dawn reported that 28 kids signed up for VBS!
- > The Youth Group wants to do a campout at the Church August 7<sup>th</sup>/8<sup>th</sup>. Council approved.
- Dawn also mentioned that the Youth Group leaders would like to host a Parents Night Out. Possibly the last Saturday of the month (Aug. 26<sup>th</sup>) from 5 9. Parents would need to sign their children up in advance. She will check with other area churches that do something similar and see what kind of rules/paperwork needs to be completed. There would also be 3-4 adults supervising this event. Council approved.
- Dawn suggested that we have a sheet that lists all the different volunteer/duties that we offer in Church. The hope is to get more involvement. She will try to put something on paper and bring to one of our next council meetings.

**Update from Pastor Search Committee:** Since the last newsletter, four more candidates applied for the pastor position, making the total 11. The committee has had phone interviews with three pastors, and narrowed the choice to two possible candidates. One of those two withdrew his candidacy, leaving us with one very strong candidate. In August, a couple committee members attended a church service of our top candidate and spent the afternoon visiting with the candidate and his wife. When questions arose about what St. John's marriage policy is, the committee worked with the council to create a policy, which the congregation voted to adopt on 10/1. The CCCC's has completed a comprehensive background check and approved the potential candidate. References have been contacted, each giving very positive feedback on the candidate. There has been a lot of communication between the candidate and committee and council members, and the council and committee are all unanimous and enthusiastic about this candidate. We have learned, however, that the compensation package we intended to offer may not be sufficient. At this time the council and committee are working to see if we are able to offer a more significant compensation package, whether for this candidate or another. We prayerfully trust that God will make it clear who He has planned to be our next pastor. Please continue to pray for the committee and council, as well as for our next pastor, that we may discern His will for us.

It was another wonderfully successful Back to School giveaway this fall. Nearly 500 children received a backpack full of school supplies between the Hutchinson and Glencoe events. Thanks to the many items and cash donated by St. John's members to help fill this important need in our community!


