Reflections

GOD & LAWN CARE

Before the meeting started, everyone went outside to do an assessment of the Church/grounds to see what needed attention. Several items were noted and will be worked on as time permits.

Dave called the meeting to order and Pastor Barry opened with prayer and a devotion.

The secretary's minutes were approved from the April 24th meeting.

Dawn gave the treasurer's report. The beginning balance was \$63,567.74 with an ending balance of \$71,184.20.

Dave called the meeting to order and opened with prayer.

The secretary's minutes were approved from the May 7th meeting.

Dawn gave the treasurer's report. The beginning balance was \$71,184.20 and after the transfer of \$25,000 to the Vanguard account, the ending balance is \$48,855.27.
